

Session III Afterschool Offerings (January 29, 2018-March 29, 2018)

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students,

We have attached our afterschool program offerings for session III. All programs are free, and a healthy meal will be provided. Your child will receive a confirmation of what program(s) he or she is enrolled in by Wednesday, January 24th. **Please return your completed form right away as classes fill up quickly and we need time to complete confirmation forms.**

Please note that **21C classes** do not meet at 3 pm on the following Wednesday early release days for this session: February 14th and March 14th. However, there will be registration forms for the activities that are being offered on March 14th from 12:15-3:00pm. **Please sign up in advance for the activities on the early release day on March 14th.** Please note that there are no early release activities being offered on February 14th due to a schoolwide training.

Our afterschool program is a partnership between Kids First (funds are provided by the Winooski School District and the PTO), the City of Winooski, and our 21C grant. Most programs are taught by licensed teachers and provide enrichment opportunities for students in the areas of literacy, math, science, social studies, technology, wellness, and the arts.

On the first day of their afterschool programs for each session, participating students in grades 1-5 can go directly to the room where their afterschool class is being held. Ms. Thomas will be in the hallway in case students need help finding their room. Participating students in Kindergarten will meet Ms. Magowan in the front lobby. Attendance will be taken when students are at their assigned classroom locations. You will receive a phone call if your child has been in school that day, but doesn't attend his/her afterschool program.

Please let us know when your child will be absent from his/her program and/or if your contact information changes during this session. **Please call 802-655-0411 (JFK Office) if you need to contact us from 3-4 pm.**

Parents and guardians are always welcome to stop in to meet afterschool program teachers and to see what wonderful learning is happening. We are always looking for volunteers to help afterschool teachers with their programs so please let us know if you are interested. We are looking forward to a great session of afterschool programs!
