Learn the martial art of Brazilian JiuJitsu (BJJ) with black belt instructor, Sensei Quinlan! Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu is a grappling art (similar to Judo) that is perfect for those who like to be active and "hands-on." Students learn take-downs, pins and holds and then apply these techniques while safely sparring.
